

The Minamata Convention on Mercury – Article 7




- ASGM has its own article (Article 7)
- Countries have to take steps to reduce mercury use in the sector
- Countries which declare the sector as "more than insignificant" have the obligation to develop a National Action Plan
- Plan needs to be submitted 3 years after notification
- Plan needs to be updated each 3 years
- GEF provides funding for NAPs (to all) and ASGM work to parties



The Minamata Convention on Mercury – Annex C




- National objectives and targets
- Eliminate the 4 worst practices
- Take steps towards formalization
- Establish baseline estimates
- Develop strategies for reducing emissions and releases, managing trade, involving stakeholders, public health, preventing exposure of vulnerable population, informing miners and their communities
- Schedule for implementation



The Global Mercury Partnership area on ASGM













Occurrence of the worst practices



Mercury reduction targets according to NAPs







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






Pillars of the Programme





What do we need to document NAP implementation progress?



- Validate and update mercury use estimation at the national level
- Ensure planetGOLD mercury reduction/eliminated/prevented/avoided calculations is rolled out to the 26 participating countries (ref Susan's presentation in session 2)
- Update NAP guidance document to include reporting update requirements
